

Swiss OK deal to give U.S. Americans' tax files

GENEVA» The Swiss parliament on Tuesday approved a treaty with the United States that will hand thousands of files on suspected tax cheats to U.S. authorities, but obstacles remain that could delay the deal for several more months.

The government hopes the agreement will eventually end UBS AG's three-year battle with U.S. tax authorities that culminated in revelations the bank had for years helped American clients hide millions of dollars in offshore accounts.

Under the treaty, which was painstakingly crafted by Bern and Washington last year after months of negotiations, Switzerland has agreed to divulge the names of 4,450 UBS clients suspected of tax evasion.

Swiss authorities have already transmitted the names of about 400 UBS clients who signed waivers as part of the Internal Revenue Service's voluntary disclosure program, according to the Swiss Federal Tax Administration. A further 100 UBS clients gave their consent directly to Swiss authorities.

The vote passed after the Swiss People's Party dropped its opposition. The nationalist party and the left-wing Social Democrats blocked a first attempt last week. *The Associated Press*

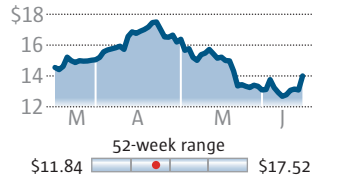

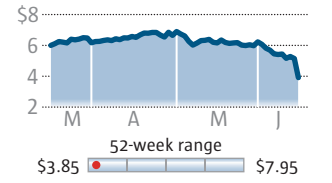

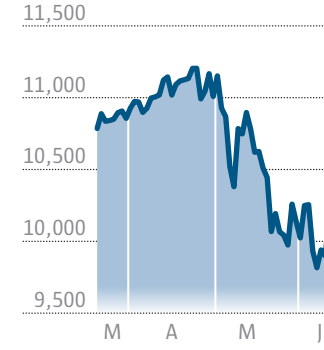

Power producers may turn to coal

NEW YORK» The 20 percent jump in natural-gas prices in the past month may prompt U.S. power producers to move to coal, as rising temperatures boost air-conditioning demand.

Gas rose to \$5.189 per million British thermal units Tuesday, the highest level in almost four months, as Commodity Weather Group, a forecaster based in Bethesda, Md., said the hottest areas over the next two weeks will be the Midwest, South and Mid-Atlantic.

The price of coal is about \$4.63 per million Btu, according to Teri Viswanath, director of commodities research at Credit Suisse Securities USA in Houston.

A switch to coal would reduce demand for gas just as power producers enter the busiest season.

Gas became cheaper than coal in March, when prices dropped to a six-month low.
